Your lyrics contain a lot of talk about anti-globalisation. about politicians lying. At a time like this when the world is supposed to be in economic crisis, do people respond better to it than they did before?

I think people are getting increasingly pissed off and desperate. they've started using methods they wouldn't have used a few year ago. I think there's definitely a movement in that direction. You can see it with all the marches now: if you take away their voice, what else are they going to do?

A lot of demonstrations are spreading all over Europe. What do you think of them, how do they compare, what do you think about the tactics and what people are doing? I think in Greece and Spain, where I've noticed it the most in Europe, it's far

Dale Farm – Imminent Eviction!

The inhabitants of Dale farm are facing eviction any day now. Entire families will be uprooted with no place to go. Families that have been living there for years are being threatened with imminent removal just of because they are Travellers, and of course the official reasoning provided is the refusal by Basildon District Council to grant planning permission as the area is officially part of the green belt. Despite the fact that the Council gave planning permission for the site to be used as a scrapyard for years before the land was legally bought by the Travellers currently settled there.

"Basildon Council is squandering millions on evicting families...

Dale Farm is home to the largest gypsy and Traveller community in the UK. Part of the site has been occupied for decades by Travellers who managed to obtain planning permission, while the section of the site threatened by eviction has had people living on it for about a decade with legal title to the land, but a refusal by the Council to grant planning permission on dubious grounds. The eviction would affect approximately 90 families, who would be left without suitable alternative accommodation. Council houses in the form of flats and other brick-and-mortar housing have been suggested, but this demonstrates a complete lack of understanding and sensitivity on behalf of the Council in regard to the needs of Travellers and the importance of the nomadic lifestyle to the Traveller

To make matters worse the Council have employed none other than Constant and Co. to carry out the eviction. This company is notorious for torching caravans and its especially violent eviction of gypsy and Traveller sites, including the events at Hovefields Drive less than a year ago, where violent tactics resulted in pregnant women being left without a roof over their heads when no alternative accommodation was provided. This last eviction cost an estimated £150.000. In a time where people are losing jobs, libraries are being shut and services are being cut, this is simply disgusting. The upcoming eviction in Dale Farm will cost the taxpayer approximately £9.5million. Rather than providing services for the people in the local area, the Council has chosen to squander money on evicting families including many children on the basis of a legal technicality, also known as racism.

It is clear hat this eviction is motivated by nothing else than clear, blatant prejudice and racism on behalf on Basildon District Council. All the Travellers are requesting is a site to legally settle their community and live in peace without harassment and eviction notices. The Dale Farm residents have been nervously awaiting their 28 day eviction notice which might be served any day now. People are needed to resist this from taking place: legal observers are necessary and many have pledged on facebook to spend a night at Dale Farm once the eviction notice is served.
